The 2024 Honor Flight Season Begins This Month

The Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN is about to take wing for the 2024 season!

Later this month, over 100 Veterans will be whisked away to our Nation's Capital, where they'll enjoy a three day/two night all expenses paid tour of the monuments and memorials built in their honor.

The May 2024 trip will be the 15th flight our hub has sponsored. While our all-volunteer group has this process down to a science, there are still new things that pop up on each trip and plenty we learn from each venture.

Our Board of Directors and volunteers are adept at keeping things running smoothly for our guests. Should there be a needed change to the agenda, we're already two steps ahead on making a plan.

Washington, DC road closures? Piece of cake! Group of school children want to spontaneously pay their respects to our heroes? We're on it. Foreign dignitary with tight security detail paying a visit to the Lincoln Memorial? We've got it all covered. Veterans and escorts need not worry about anything on our trips.

Get to Know One of Our Flight Veterans

Dennis Eggebraaten (Eggs as he would later be known), was facing a fork in his life's road in the early 70s. After four years of college, he hadn't yet graduated from Moorhead State and knew he would be drafted. Wanting more control of his future, he decided to join the South Dakota National Guard. Except, due to the mission needs, they were unable to get him out to basic training in a timely manner. At that point, Dennis told himself to go with the flow and volunteered for the Army.

By 1971, Eggs found himself on a (cont'd on next page)

Eggs formed a deep-

flight bound for Vietnam, as one of the US Army's freshest Chaplain's Assistants.

For the next nine months, Dennis would visit orphanages in an attempt to teach the caretaker nuns basic English. Frequently, he and many fellow soldiers would volunteer to spend time holding the sweet, innocent babies and rocking them to sleep ... a juxtaposition not lost on him in the midst of raging jungle battles. However, he and his fellow religious support comrades were most often called upon to deliver a gravely ill or injured soldier's last rites and provide guidance.

Eggs was faced with many

difficult cases ... battle injuries, mental health emergen-

cies, and drug overdoses. It was an environment that was taxing even on the toughest.

When the US government sought early discharge volunteers for a force draw down, Dennis took them up on it, knowing he'd forfeit some of the financial benefits of serving. He had done his time, seen enough, and was ready to close this chapter.

Except ... returning home wasn't much easier. As we know, the US wasn't welcoming of her returning Vietnam Veterans. For years, Dennis would do his best to put the military behind him, not talking about it much until after September 11, 2001 — when he finally felt pride in his service creeping back in.

A few years ago, he was convinced to throw his hat into the ring for a ticket on an Honor Flight. After feeling like there were certainly folks that de-

served it more, he was told all honorably discharged troops

qualified regardless of combat or deployment status. He got his call up for the October 2023 Veterans Honor Flight of ND/MN ... this time a much happier type of draft notice.

As luck would have it, a buddy from high school was also slated for the trip. The two were booked to be roommates, easing Dennis's mind.

Dennis and James Cameron (US Army, Fisher, MN) had a wonderful time — opening up to each other about their service and experiences in Vietnam like never before. They shared stories neither knew and bonded on a deeper level, despite their 60+ year friendship. Dennis was also glad to make friends with many of the other Veterans on the trip. Knowing many of the folks who had earned this trip had similar memories was comforting.

He has advice for Veterans contemplating applying for a flight: "Do it! It doesn't matter where you served or what you did ... it was all in support of the greater mission. You deserve this trip and the healing and gratitude it provides. The whole thing is magical!"

Since returning, Dennis has shared his Honor Flight stories with many fellow Veterans, convincing them to apply—and we love to hear it! With our community's help, as long as we can keep funding these trips of a lifetime, we'll continue shuttling our heroes out to Washington, DC so more of them can get their proper appreciation, just like Eggs.

Know Before You Go — Real IDs Needed to Fly May 7, 2025

Anyone who wishes to travel via commercial or chartered airline beginning May 7, 2025 will need to possess a Real ID.

Real IDs can be obtained at your local Driver and Vehicle Services in Minnesota and Driver License offices in North Dakota. You will be required to bring several documents to your appointment to obtain your Real ID. Be sure to reference the website listed here to determine there is a star on your ID card. If there's NOT a star, your card won't be valid for air travel next May.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to apply

for your Real ID now. The process can take some time and we never know what could potentially impact the processing turnaround time.

If you don't have a Real ID, a Passport may also be used for travel.

moved by his experience he wanted to do more to help but didn't know where to start. So, he did what he could with what he had — he went door-to-door asking for free-will donations.



Insider Trip Secrets — Fort McHenry

O! Say can you see ... where Francis Scott Key wrote the poem "Defence of Fort M'Henry," which later was set to music and became our country's National Anthem? Well, when you fly on one of our flights you sure will!

Fort McHenry National Monument and Historic Shrine is just a stone's throw from Baltimore Washington International Thurgood Marshall Airport (BWI) ... where we've elected to fly into for the last few years. Veterans have consistently listed this stop as one of the highlights of the trip.

There, among other significant events, they learn of the Battle of Baltimore in 1814 that inspired the Star Spangled Banner. In this pivotal

battle in the War of 1812, American military forces saved the city of Baltimore from being burned by the British the way our nation's capital had been just a month previous.

An intriguing movie, historical artifacts, intelligent staff, and an immaculate campus awaits all who tour this important part of our American history.
